






2.1.1 Students' Enrollment Percentage

2.1.2 Students' Enrollment against reserved categories.





- Exam in charge follows the case, remain in touch with university and maintain the records.
- After correction, it is communicated to the student.
- •Student may ask for copy through RTI and may apply for re-evaluation.
